## **Dropped Kerb / Parking**

I would like make a plea to all parents / carers who are collecting children by car to please be mindful of those around you. Parking has become an issue around the school and I receive regular complaints from residents and other parents about the inconsiderate parking of a few.

We have a disabled parent in a wheelchair who has been unable to collect their child because someone has parked across the dropped kerb on Badley's close near to the junction with Folly road. This is the only dropped kerb that can be used by this parent to get into school.

There have also been complaints about people parking across driveways and blocking residents in as well as parking on double yellow lines.

We all want the children to be safe coming to school. We have a staggered drop off period from 8:35am until 8:45am to try and ease the congestion in the morning. Please think carefully about where you park your car.
